



Gónhóll



History.

Gónhóll was built in the eighties by Mr. Þorvarður Örnólfsson and his late wife, Anna Garðarsdóttir. It was originally built as a family style summer chalet. Fannborg acquired the chalet in 2002 and in 2010 it was rebuilt to suit the type of operations Fannborg drives to day.

The name Gónhóll comes from the location, as from the balcony, one can see straight onto the hot pools that once were located close to the common shower house. The word Gónhóll means a hill from where one can look curiously from. Similar word in English is “Ogle hill”.

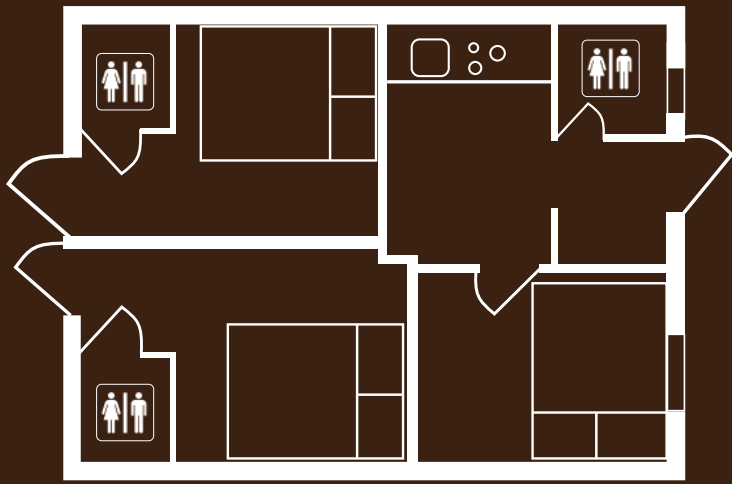
Gónhóll is divided into three units. G1 has a double bedroom, en-suite kitchenette and bathroom on the ground floor, and a single, double and a large mattress area on the first floor, potentially housing over half a dozen visitors.

G2 and G3 are large private rooms with double beds and en suite bathrooms.





Facilities



Gónhóll is the innermost chalet in Kerlingarfjöll. Follow the footpath south from the central building until you reach the last chalet. There are two entrances, one on either side of the A shaped roof.
